## Endicott College and Gloucester400™ Partner to Collect and Preserve the City's Fascinating Oral History

"Our People, Our Stories" to Come to Life in the Words of the People Who Built Gloucester

**Gloucester, MA – February 14, 2020** – Gloucester Celebration Corporation (GCC), the official organizers of Gloucester's 400<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration, and Endicott College have signed an agreement to collaborate on collection and preservation of Gloucester's oral history. As a result of this agreement, the Endicott's Center for Oral History will work to facilitate the collection of Gloucester's stories by its citizens and assist in laying the foundation for a successful project.

As part of the collaboration, faculty members Dr. Michael Kilburn and Dr. Lara Salahi will co-lead a series of three workshops for community members interested in helping capture the City's narratives for posterity. In these workshops, Drs. Kilburn and Salahi will help the community define compelling topics on which the project will focus and identify prospective interviewees. Professor Kilburn will also conduct the first two project interviews in a live demonstration of best practices. These interviews will be taped and transcribed for inclusion in a commemorative oral history book that will be made available to the community in 2023.

"Our people, our stories" is more than a tagline. This phrase sits at the heart of Gloucester's 400<sup>th</sup>-anniversary celebration. It is hoped that, with the assistance of Drs. Kilburn and Salahi, the people of Gloucester will successfully bring this theme to life through the telling of the stories that represent the city's 400-year history.

Gloucester's oral history project is underwritten by a portion of the proceeds of a state grant from the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, that was secured through the dedicated efforts of State Representative Ann Margaret Ferrante and State Representative Bruce Tarr.

Gloucester 400 tri-chairperson Bruce Tobey commented that, "Our entire team is grateful to Endicott College for its willingness to partner with us, and to our legislative delegation for their hard work in securing the financial resources that will fuel our efforts. We are looking forward to producing a powerful anthology that honors Gloucester's past, reflects on its present, and looks ahead to its future."
